V. District Initiatives for Review, Comment, and Recommendations

A) Draft Communications & Engagement Program Review (Bromelkamp)

Ms. Bromelkamp reported on the Draft Communications & Engagement Program Review. The Communications and Engagement Division has four staff members overseeing fifteen programs in addition to supporting programs in the other divisions. The work of this Division has increased significantly in the past five years. A staff input review of the Division was performed to look at strengths and weaknesses of the Division and identify possible recommendations. Divisional strengths identified include the relationships that have been established both within and outside CRWD, ability to reduce barriers, promote diversity, build knowledge and establish communication. Growth opportunities identified include digital communication, work plans, Artist in Residence, a CRWD Watershed Learning Center and improving efficiency. Next steps will be putting the Draft Review out comments.

B) Partner Grant Program Review Charter (Schwantes)

Ms. Schwantes led a discussion on the Partner Grant Program Review Charter. Partner Grants help organizations in the CRWD fund water quality improvement projects. It was started in 2007 and has expanded significantly since then. Staff are looking for input and feedback on how the program has been working and how it can be improved to better meet the goals and resources of the District. Several CAC members had participated on Partner Grant committees in the past and provided their input on the Program. A summary report is expected later on this year.

The purpose for the framework is to make the campus area more welcoming to Minnesotans by making it pedestrian friendly by decreasing impervious surfaces and creating more greenspace. CRWD is looking for opportunities to incorporate stormwater treatment features into the design. Comments were being taken until April 15.
