POSITION OBJECTIVE:

The District will provide practical water resource and watershed management experience to young people who may be interested in careers in watershed management. The term of employment is 9 weeks at up to 35 hours/week.

POSITION DESCRIPTION:

This position will join each of the District's Divisions for a period of time during their employment to observe and assist with the tasks described below:

Administrative Division

- Review CRWD's History Report and attend evening Community Advisory Committee and Board of Managers meetings to learn about our structure, programs and projects
- Review CRWD's Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Plan and learn how it's being used to reach more District residents

Monitoring, Research & Maintenance Division

- Learn about watersheds, pollution, and water quality
- Assist with water quality testing throughout the District
- Learn how data is analyzed to understand water quality trends
- Learn about different approaches to lake management

Communications & Engagement Division

- Assist with planning and attending community and youth engagement events/programs
- Collaborate with partner organizations and community members
- Evaluate and expand resources for community and youth events
- Assist in developing content for print and digital communications

Planning, Projects & Grants Division

- Learn about clean water projects, how they function, and their benefits
- Assist with Clean Water Grant site visits and plan review.
- Assist with performing inspections of CRWD and partner clean water projects
- Learn about wildlife habitat restoration projects

Regulatory Division

- Learn about CRWD's Stormwater Rules and Permitting Program
- Learn about construction best management practices
- Assist with inspections at construction sites and previously constructed stormwater practices
- Learn about wetlands and their role in watershed management and permitting
- Learn about detecting and resolving illicit discharges to our waterways

COMPENSATION:

\$19.32/hour. This position includes paid holidays. This position is also eligible to receive Earned Sick and Safe time (ESST), according to State and local laws, and will accrue 1 hour of ESST for every 30 hours worked. Limited, unpaid time off is allowed with prior approval.
